

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That an advalorem tax of two-fifths of one per cent, he levied for the support of the State Government, the payment of its debts, and the promotion of the general welfare, upon the assessed cash value of the following subjects, to wit: (1) Real Estate in this State. (2.) All slaves in this State (excepting such as the County Courts may have exempted, or may hereafter exempt from taxation on account of bodily or mental infirmity,) to be taxed according to value, which value is to be ascertained by the same persons who assess the value of lands. (3) Money due from solvent debtors, or on hand, or on deposit with individuals, or in the banks, or other corporations, Provided, That Confederate and State Treasury Notes shall be considered money,...
